• Treasurer report – Kelly A

- Kelly A taking over from Kristen J as PAC treasurer
- No check from cultural grant for Chinese acrobats yet
- Field trip: another check for 5th grade trip to Patriot Hall, ~ \$2000
- Holiday shop and breakfast generated ~ \$4000
- Walpole Wheel: with holiday raffles, close to year profit goal already!
- Magnets and ornaments generated about \$50
- Holiday sing-a-long: not a fundraiser, free
- o \$5000 supplied for patio and a sum moved to Sunshine Fund
- Platforms to transition things smoother proposed

• New platform options – Kelly A

- Entering data manually, generating monthly reports, accounting for cash/venmo time-consuming, human error
- Platforms available for PACs specifically
- On those platforms you can donate, volunteer, create sign ups, have a friendship directory all in one place
- Friendship directory filter options show only some information to some users
- Easier to pass down the role and more secure
- Make account to join PAC for a specific event, saves your information/donations, helps with personal taxes, reminders, etc., opts out families of 6th graders
- Money Minder and Cheddar Up
- Future Fund made by former PAC presidents, free
- Elm street school uses a third option
- On't want to take away venmo, cash usage convenience but more organized, less work for people joining in
- o In contact with Elm chair about other events, will discuss this as well
