• Welcome, sign-in sheet, introduce new officers

• Treasurer report - Kristen and Kelly

- Monthly presentation of PAC income
- Budget covers: activities; school-based costs like supplies, staff appreciation,
 admin costs; income; sub-funds
- Expenses exceed income; more fundraising will be planned
- o Income accumulated over COVID reflected in positive balance
- Expenditures-to-date: Boyden folders and teacher planners, K popsicle meetup, admin costs
- Income-to-date: \$700 check from Shutterfly, school supply kits from last year; State Street grant for Docent field trips
- Budget approved
- \$5,000 from playground approved to be moved to new patio out back to be used by teachers and students; MF landscaping will be volunteering to construct the patio, but \$9000 of their costs should be offset; fundraise through a kick-off specially themed Wheel of Fortune to raise the rest

• Scholastic Book Fair

- Renee will be working with Ms. Moses, but volunteers needed to help students select wish lists of books
- Parents will be purchasing books using the wish list during parent teacher conferences or online
- The Fair will be running during conferences: 10/25, 6-8 pm; 10/27 1-3pm;
 11/2 (virtual conferences), 6-8 pm
- Elizabeth Caressimo will help
- All profits will go to the media center and teacher libraries

• 5th Grade Parent Committee

- Stef Hollister will share information from last year on budgets, etc.
- This is not a PAC event and part of the committee's work will be to fundraise for a 5th grade end-of-year celebration
- Elizabeth, Ali, Elitsa will help

• 5th grade gift from PAC

- Fixed PAC contribution is \$25/student and there are 66 5th grade students
- Instead of towels (exceeded \$25), create a yearbook?
- Lisa priced it out roughly to \$10-\$18/student
- Survey 5th students on what they want their gift to be?
- Tumbler filled with candy?
- How to organize a yearbook so that every student is equally represented?
- o 5th grade committee can work on that idea as well

• Point person for each grade

- One current/former PAC officer will serve as a point person for each grade
- Looking for 1-2 additional volunteers per grade to help
- Point person will get families with students in each grade involved; share important information about each grade on upcoming events; welcome new families; update each grade's Facebook page, connect with each grade's teachers, and so on
- Point person is welcome to organize additional events for the parents of students in each grade, like meet-ups, etc.

• Boyden playground

- \$5,000 of playground funds will be moved to the patio project, \$5,000 will remain for repairs
- Large repairs will be referred to the town, as playground ground surfaces are too costly for PAC to cover

Trunk or Treat

- Friday night before Halloween 10/27/23, 6-7:30
- Families to decorate cars and give out candy outside of the school
- Only bathrooms next to the gym to be used inside school
- Need to secure custodian and access to outlets to plug in decorations
- Need volunteers urgently for this first PAC event of the year
- 10/28 as potential rain date
- Make sure pool light is turned on (Walpole Parks and Rec); collect personal flood lights to make sure the playground is safe and well lit
- Tickets would be \$5/\$20 cap per family (with additional donations welcomed)
 to offset costs for additional candy bought by the PAC, decorations, any
 snacks, raffles, gift bags for each kid
- Use sound system PAC owns; borrow blow-up screen for more entertainment

Holiday breakfast/shop

- PAC's largest event
- o Holiday breakfast and raffle of items donated by each grade in the cafeteria
- Holiday shop in the gym for students only, with help of Boyden alums
- Need to organize soon, since the items for the shop need to be purchased in advance
- Jenn G: holiday pop-up shop to use for at least a portion of the shop, items send in, part of profit goes back to company and rest remains for PAC/Boyden, unsold items sent back and PAC reimbursed for those
- o Dec 2, 8-11:30 am
- Could people donate unused or gently used items to be sold as well?

• Fundraising: Cookie fundraiser (Jenn G):

- Otis Spunkmeyer cookies and other items
- Pamphlets to go to student folders 9/22
- Families have until Oct 13 (possibly Oct 18) to send back forms and money so that cookies arrive before Thanksgiving
- Orders shipped to school
- Prizes like Razor scooter to be raffled off, being at Boyden
- Help needed with handing out purchases when they arrive as storage at Boyden limited
- Charge \$10-\$15 for volunteers to deliver orders directly to families' homes

Wheel of Fortune:

- Raffle off prizes with limited number of entries so that good chance to win
- Have more consistency here: for ex., one Wheel raffle every Wednesday or every other Wednesday with few specially themed weeks

• **Dining for Dollars:** Stef Hollister

 Contact restaurants to set monthly dining out, where part of the profit goes to the school

• Shutterfly fundraiser: Stef Hollister

 Harder to use, because parents have purchase through a storefront rather than just use a code and their own account

• Minted: Stef Hollister

• Get a code to use for holiday cards, part of profit goes to the school

New fundraising ideas:

Nothing bundt cakes – Elizabeth C

 Booster: 2 weeks, students run to raise money; Principal Dearborn needs to confirm feasibility and extent of commitments from the school and teachers

• Running Club and Boyden Fun Run:

- o Group of students run for 1 hour after school once a week for 4 weeks
- Need someone to organize and supervise, but they do not need to actually do any running
- o Organize a 1-mile Fun Run; Joe Grant from Run House helps with that
- Runing Club might have to end as a program if no one volunteers this year

Docent: Stef Hollister

- Well organized program for all elementary schools where parent volunteers teach students about art and supervise an activity for 1 hour every month
- Field trips for 2nd and 4th grade
- o PowerPoint and notes given to volunteers in advance, they are also trained
- Not a large time commitment; great way to see own student's classroom
- Volunteers always needed

• Principal updates:

- Great start of the year; Kindergarten class is adjusting to expectations
- Boyden expectations developed and reinforced for all grades
- Principal Dearborn presented expectations to each grade and posters to remind students around the school
- Be respectful, be responsible, be safe, #BeBoyden
- Counselors will reinforce expectations during their first class visits
- Fridge in staff lounge needs to be replaced: Elizabeth C. will contact Poirier and try to get a donation or a discount
- Some delays for school buses, school is working to resolve these
- Field trips will be planned for all grades
- o Can Boyden get a grant as a Title I school: Elizabeth to connect with Kelly A
